We provided free ORCA cards for people working in the Chinatown, Little Saigon, Japantown, and Pioneer Square neighborhoods in food service and grocery industries to help get Seattle employees to work affordably and efficiently.



1,665 people received ORCA Recovery Cards

84% use their ORCA Recovery Card three or more times per week




91% say they take transit more often with the ORCA Recovery Card

The ORCA Recovery Card program is possible thanks to 80 percent of Seattle voters passing the Seattle Transit Measure (Proposition 1), which created a revenue source for more frequent, reliable, accessible bus service in our city. Through a 0.15% sales tax (the equivalent of 15 cents on a \$100 purchase) you are directly supporting transit access in your community.
